
Fall Worship Schedule

Global Missions

Bethania Kids is planning a new **Shalom Home** for girls. The need for a permanent Shalom Home was confirmed years ago with the purchase of property in Packiapurum, India.

Bethania Kids is now able to begin design and construction of the new home that will be 8,000 square feet and have provisions to house 50 girls. The long awaited facility will provide a permanent location for the Shalom Home since they have operated in rented space since its inception. Presently they move the Shalom residence children every 3 to 4 years and have insufficient space to comply with the Social Welfare guidelines. These children are outstanding students in the local schools, excelling in their studies and advancing their education. The new Shalom Home will allow the children to continue in their current schools and will provide much needed space for future operations.

Stay tuned: When construction plans and schedule are complete, we will approach Bethel to ask for your prayers and financial support.

Parish Nursing: The Faith Community Nurse (FCN)

Faith Community Nursing, formerly called parish nursing is a professional specialty practice recognized by the American Nurses Association. Faith Community Nursing focuses on the mind, body and spirit of health with emphasis on spiritual well-being. The parish nursing movement began in 1984 by Lutheran Chaplain Granger Westberg. Chaplain Westberg identified the nurse as the ideal healthcare professional to promote “whole” wellness, mind, body and spirit in a setting where people are already gathered to nurture their spiritual life.

Today there are over sixty Faith Community Nurses serving in 50 congregations in the Shenandoah Valley. The nurses have the potential to promote health to more than 30,000 persons in our region! Over 500 nurses have received certification through Shenandoah University, as well as, quarterly educational opportunities provided through Valley Health. Valley Health continues to recognize and support the Faith Community Nurses throughout the region. Reen Markland, RN FCN is the Faith Community Coordinator at WMC. Reen collaborates with Lisa Zerull, PhD, RN Director to provide education, resources and initiatives to create and maintain this important practice throughout our community.

Nursing to me has always been spiritual! I love talking, sharing, and praying with my brothers and sisters at church. Proverbs 27:23 states “Know the state of your flocks, and put your heart into caring for your herds.” This verse recognizes and emphasizes my nursing practice throughout the years. Nursing is relationship focused, building trust, instilling confidence and surrounding the patient in a nurturing, spiritual, and healing state of well-being.

So what’s next at Bethel? Pastor Dave and I would like to resurrect the Health and Wellness Team and are working to achieve that goal. A community assessment is in the works. Quarterly information/education/awareness

sessions are being planned for Adult Forum. BP checks, resources, and question and answer time will be revived. What would you like to see at Bethel?
