

Council Highlights from May

Pastor's Report

Pastor Dave Young provided a quick overview of May. He highlighted the Apple Blossom Sports breakfast at which he was asked to speak. He updated council on his involvement with obtaining a new pastor for a church in Mt. Sidney, VA. F3 ministry for 1-4 graders is now up and running; the Inquires class will take place May 22; Pastor Dave is serving as the webmaster for our website; all are invited to participate in the Pub and Praise, June 13, 6-7:30 p.m., Piccadilly Pub. He also stated that the Bethel podcasts (Bethelcasts!) are going well. He also added that there are approximately 40 people viewing the on-line Daily Devotions.

Treasurer's Report

Traci Shoberg stated that April's financial standing has improved due to increased giving after Pastor Dave Young's sermon and the letter sent to Bethel's membership providing a financial update and giving options. Pastor Dave Young provided for Council's review and consideration a financial breakdown with possible decreases/changes in financial spending. Discussion continued on how Bethel can continue to decrease expenses as well as questioning if our expenses and our overall ministry involvement are within normal ranges. It was also agreed that Council should keep reminding Bethel's membership to consider changing how they allocate their giving and to prayerfully consider if they can give more toward our ongoing expenses.

Parsonage Status Update – Property Disposition/Maintenance

Tom Milburn stated that the Parsonage sale is in the hands of the trustees and it will be sold per the directions in the Will. Further updates will be provided monthly.

Music Ministry Status

Pastor Dave Young reported that he and Darline DeMott are discussing the role of Director of Music. He stated that Grace Eisenhauer will continue to serve as Interim Director of Music through the summer.



Global Missions

Howard and Earline Kemnitz visited our mission partners at Concordia Children's Services in Manila in the Philippines in April. Howard serves on the Board of Directors for CCS, and their visit coincided with a meeting of the Board. Howard and Earline shared about their experience with the Adult Forum Sunday School Class on May 15. Some key points from their report:

- In the third quarter of 2015, 29 babies were taken in by CCS
- 14 children were adopted
- 7 babies are being treated for TB, and 3 are being treated for scabies
- Sponsored children include 47 elementary school age children, 30 high school students, and 5 college students
- Cash reserves for CCS total about \$10,000, which represents a significant safety net, and opportunity for maintenance or improvements to facilities
- The director of CCS in Manila resigned due to family health concerns. An interim director is in place, and a candidate for a permanent replacement has been identified.

Planning for a Bethel mission to visit CCS is in the works. The planned timeframe is April 2018. The trip will include six or seven days in the Philippines, and participants will learn about Philippine life and culture, visit sites of general interest, and spend time interacting with children at CCS to better understand the needs of the children and the role that CCS can play in their lives.



We also heard news from Neema Landey, a student who attended the Maasi Girls Lutheran Secondary School near Arusha Tanzania from 1998 through 2005 with the aid of sponsors from Bethel before attending the University of Dar es Salaam.

Because of her leadership while working with the WYCA in Dar es Salaam, Neema has been selected for a slot in the Mandela Washington Fellowship Program, which is designed to empower youth from Africa through academic coursework, leadership training, networking and mentor-ship programs. She will spend time at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA and attend a Presidential Summit in Washington D.C.

Neema was born in a rural village in Tanzania where most girls never have the opportunity to be educated beyond the primary level. In her letter to Diane Jacoby, OBA Director, Neema wrote:

"All this could not be possible if not for the seed planted by OBA. I am so thankful and grateful for OBA. May the Good Lord bless you all. I hope to share the knowledge and experience with my community and youth in my country."

These two stories, taken together, remind us that supporting education for the poorest of the poor through our mission partners not only helps a child in poverty, but also helps that child grow into a potential leader that can become a blessing to her people and can support the growth and development that can lead to real change for the better.
