Summer Worship @ Bethel

First, I want to thank everyone who took the time to fill out our survey on summer worship and participate in sharing your thoughts. We were so happy to have almost 100 responses. This gave us a very thorough sense of congregational thought.

As I shared last month in the Bethel Banner, we received 65% percent of our responses from 8:30 attendees and 42% from 11:00 attendees (3% float between the services). Of these responses, the majority of 8:30 attendees (65%) chose a 9:00am service. The majority of 11:00 attendees (56%) chose 10:00. We had 16% of 8:30 attendees and 15% of 11:00 attendees choose 9:30.

I have decided to go with **one service at 9:30**. This is a nice compromise as 9:30 is the time when many 8:30 folks remain and many 11:00 folks arrive to attend Sunday school during the year. Having one service allows us to worship with those we don't often get to worship with during the majority of year. The one service also allows us to offer the Ensemble in its fullest form, which I know many people enjoy and desire. It also allows the Ensemble to have a bit of a break, which they certainly deserve. All in all, this seemed to be something worth trying this summer. While it will require some sacrifice, I do value that it is a shared sacrifice on all our part.

Additionally, we are planning to offer 6 midweek worship experiences this summer. These 6 midweek worship offerings will enhance our summer worship experience. Grace and I are working to offer unique and meaningful services which will be held either in Discipleship Hall or outside, will offer Holy Communion, and will include a unique message each time that will be offered, not by me, but by people within our congregation. You will be able to hear some of their story and how they live and follow Jesus in their lives. This time of testimony should be a highlight for our summer together.

We will offer these 6 midweek services on **the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays** in June (8 and 22), July (13 and 27), and August (10 and 24). My hope is that you will mark these dates as opportunities to remain connected to Bethel through worship if you are out of town many weekends, but also perhaps as a recharge for your week if you are in worship most Sundays.

Our summer worship schedule will begin on Sunday, May 29 (Memorial Day weekend) and extend through Sunday, September 4 (Labor Day weekend). We will return to 8:30 and 11:00 worship services on Sunday, September 11.

So, thank you again for taking time to share your opinions and thoughts. I am excited for the summer and look forward to being family together more often as we seek to be *a community growing deeper in faith and wider in love!*

Council Highlights from April

The council met on Wednesday, April 13. Below are the highlights from the April meeting (not the official minutes).

Treasurer's Report

Traci Shoberg provided an update stating that Bethel's finances are currently positive. However, finances are tight and the next few months may be tough. She stated we will have to see what money March brings in. Pastor Dave added that Bethel has been named in a Will and we will be receiving a sum of money, somewhere between \$8,000 and \$14,000. It was suggested that this money go into Bethel's General Fund.

Vernon Joyner Recognition Planning

Pastor Dave spoke with Vernon Joyner explaining that Bethel wants to say "Thank You" for all his years of service decorating the church, etc. Vernon was delighted. This will take place on May 29 during and after Sunday service.

Our Family Center

Pastor Dave stated that the leadership of Our Family approached him and explained that their new CEO wants to expand services that would be offered at Bethel and will need 4, possibly 5, days of usage in Discipleship Hall. This will provide Bethel with additional income and he sees no issues with increasing days as they are here from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. In addition, Our Family is willing to work around any special space needs that may come (i.e. funerals, VBS, yard sale, etc.). Pastor Dave also stated that because Our Family will be increasing staff, there will be a need to upgrade Bethel's internet and this most likely will be accomplished through grant money provided to Our Family.

Narthex Update

Jack McAllister is building a Welcome sign for the space where our current Prayer book is located, which will be moved to the other side.



Global Missions

Tanzania Update: Dr. Mark Jacobson, the doctor in charge of the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center (ALMC), whom Bethel helps sponsor, has joined forces with the Kilimanjaro Christian Medical Center (KCMC) to begin building and staffing a regional Cancer Treatment Center. To date there has been no significant attempt to treat cancer in the North East region of Tanzania. The population going without any oncology service is estimated at 7-8 million people. The need is huge.

KCMC is about 60 miles from Arusha and is one of five medical schools in Tanzania. That is the medical school where Dr. Timi Sunumi is doing his residency and where Dr. Nanyoke Nasira did her internship. Both of these talented Tanzanians were helped by Bethel sponsorship.

Our involvement is making a difference in the lives of many by providing education for healthcare providers.

Footwashing via “Cells of Love”?

Cells of love healing every body one foot at a time

I recently proposed (see the following) an idea of washing people’s feet in and around our community to spread more love and compassion in and around our world. It is an idea I have been contemplating for awhile. If you are interested in being part of a footwashing “cell of love”, I will be having a meeting on Saturday, May14th at 1:00 p.m. in Discipleship Hall for anyone who is interested in helping. You may email me at heididavidyoung955@gmail.com with questions or for more information.

Goal : To wash as many people’s feet in and around Winchester, VA and Frederick County as is possible in the next year in order to spread love, healing and compassion in our community.

Strategy :

- 1 Convene a group from Bethel, a “cell of love”, of people willing to go out and wash people’s feet wherever people are gathered.
- 2 Target specific groups to whom we can go and wash feet (the Muslim community, Jewish community, NAACP, Our Family, our detention center, CCAP, WINCOG, Valley Health employees, Sheetz employees, Rubbermaid employees, police officers, city council, school boards, Grace Lutheran Church, Victory, Fellowship Bible, judges, Rescue Mission . . . the list is endless really).
- 3 Call someone who is a member of the group to explain our mission and see if they are willing to participate. Set up a time at the beginning or end of an already established meeting of said group to go and wash feet.
- 4 Go and wash feet sharing our purpose in doing so and also Jesus’ command to go and wash feet.

Case for Support: In the gospel of John, Chapter 13, Jesus washes his disciples’ feet during his last supper with them. He then commands them to wash one another’s feet. He says this more than once. Typically, it is an intimate group washing one another’s feet in a community of faith, in a family, in a retreat setting. Attempting to wash people’s feet with whom we don’t have an established relationship will probably be an uphill battle. But when our world is so dying, literally, for compassion and love, I am willing to give it a try.

As I reflect on the act of footwashing, it occurs to me that to submit to having one’s foot washed and to submit to washing someone else’s foot, each participant has to die a little bit to their own ego. In these acts of submission, and in these acts of little, tiny deaths in and for one another, I believe love and healing are born.

Instead of ‘terrorist cells’ that we hear way too often about, let’s create ‘cells of love.’ These are groups of people willing to go out and die a little to themselves by washing someone else’s feet. Cells of love are about creating more compassion, more understanding, and perhaps a little healing, as we symbolically care for one another’s feet. Cells of love are about healing and loving everybody - everybody who is willing to have their feet washed - no one is excluded.

The idea of a ‘cell of love’ may be expanded to include groups of people who want to go and do other acts of healing and love in the community besides footwashing. I am focusing my time and energy, however, on footwashing cells of love.


