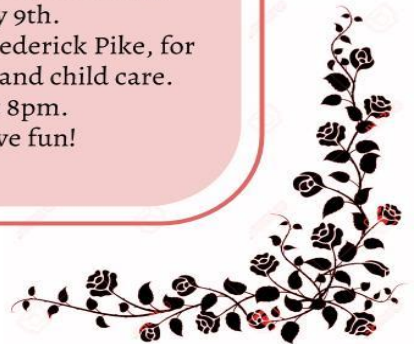

## Pastor's Page

### *"Canoeing the Mountains"*

The Bethel council and I are reading a book entitled, *"Canoeing the Mountains"* by Tod Bolsinger. The central thesis of this book is that the American church is now in "uncharted territory"; that what we've always known and what has always worked for "church" is no longer. Bolsinger uses the epic adventure of Lewis and Clark as the guiding image for this conversation.

You remember them I am sure. They set out to find the "northwest passage" from the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific Ocean. They canoed their way along the mighty Missouri river all the way across the country until they reached the pinnacle of the continental divide; expecting that the hard part was over and that they would now coast to the coast downhill.

Instead, what they saw was the Rockies. The terrain before them was not like the terrain they had always known, nor what they expected. They had to figure out a whole new way to move forward. They had to learn how to "canoe the mountains".

I have already found wonderful nuggets of grace from this book. One of the most important insights is that we must embrace a spirit of adventure that allows for new possibilities of being the church. And to do this most effectively, it means that I need to share with you that I DON'T KNOW EXACTLY HOW TO DO THIS!

As a leader, I regularly feel I am supposed to have the answers. However, I wasn't trained for this new terrain any more than you. I am trained for where we've been, just as you are familiar with what has always been. I am learning on the job, as are you. And while I am not always comfortable sharing that I am unsure about where to go, I am heartened and freed by saying it. Jesus said, "The truth will set you free." And I do feel free. And I feel excited.

**And what excites me most is figuring all of this out with you.** Listening to the Spirit together and imagining together how God might be calling us to get those canoes over the mountains in front of us. Or maybe we trade in our canoes for hiking gear and evolve and do things differently. Regardless, we are embarking on a new adventure but what gives me hope is that we are not alone, but we are in this together.

I encourage you to pick up the book. It is written for congregational leadership, but it is also written for Christians to learn and grow in their own lives too. The more people looking in the same direction, the better.

So, let's do this in 2019. Let's work together to listen and plan and dream and share and risk and fail and try again and move toward the goal of being a place that seeks to do mission in the most loving and effective way that we can. And if we don't exactly know what we're doing, well ... there's grace for that!

## Bethel Youth Protection Policy

For several years Congregation Council has wrestled with a balancing act of implementing guidelines to help prevent sexual abuse or misconduct as well as false accusations arising from congregational activities. In February of 2017 the Council adopted a series of policies to provide for youth protection.

Those policies are designed to update our practices to better ensure and protect the congregation and participants from inappropriate actions. For many years, adults that participate in Synod activities have undergone a Synod background check. We are initiating the same standard here. We will soon offer training gatherings to enhance how we serve all children, youth, and adults. Moving forward, we are returning to requiring written permission from parents before undertaking activities. Our insurance carrier now provides coverage for sexual misconduct claims due to this policy.

As we continue to grow deeper in faith and wider in love, we have taken the appropriate steps to nurture continued growth. If you have questions, comments or concerns, please take these to any member of Council.

# Global Missions News

**Concordia** - This past 2018 the Philippine government's Dept of Social Welfare officially recognized and celebrated Concordia's strong commitment to help and rescue children. We thank our donors for providing us the support to serve these children. Indeed, we are humbled that out of thousands of organizations we were chosen as the **2018 Best Non-Government Organization (NGO)** in the Philippines. We received this award from the Philippine government for our exemplary contribution to the disadvantaged sector. In giving the award they noted that Concordia facilitated the adoption of hundreds of abandoned and surrendered babies and sponsored/provided education for thousands of underprivileged children until they finish high school.

We also received our accreditation renewal, as an institution that acts honestly with donor funds, from the Philippine Council for NGO Certification in June 2018. Our accreditation proves that we maintain the standards of good governance, management and accountability. Below are examples of what a difference Concordia and donors like you can make:

## His BEST Life After Adoption

Mads, now 22, was born in Manila. He grew up at Concordia's home until he was adopted by a Danish family in 1998, when he was 2 years and 5 months old. Now he has the Best loving parents, Jan and Marianne; and a sister who was adopted from Romania. Last February 4, 2018, Mads came back to the Philippines for a visit with his mother. He said that it was a fantastic experience.

He now lives in his own apartment in Denmark and works as a teacher and assistant in his school. He loves to stay fit and play soccer. He is also good in entertaining people. He sometimes goes to children's circuses where he juggles. He has even performed abroad with a circus.



Today, he values making friends and helping other people. Like all adopted children from Concordia, Mads has been an inspiration to all of us. We love to see children we cared for years ago and celebrate how they have flourished.

## Her BEST achievement as Concordia's Scholar

Faye, one of Concordia's sponsored EAS students through high school, is now a Licensed Physical Therapist after passing the 2018 licensure examination for physical therapists. Our Concordia family is very proud of her BEST achievement as a scholar.

We also congratulate 4 other students who graduated from senior high school last April 2018. They were the first batch who completed the enhanced basic education program in the country.

## Global Missions News continued...

Dear Dear Friends in Christ,

What a year! What a time! What a gift of ministry that God has given to us all, together in Tanzania. Linda and I have now spent 33 years of our lives in Arusha and 36 years in Africa.

We have always believed that what was most important was to help develop a team who would carry on after us and not only continue what we have done but to surpass it. We believe we are at this point. The team in place has now really taken the lead. Largely under their direction, ALMC has achieved another two huge awards of recognition this year. First, for the second year in a row, we are the cleanest hospital in Tanzania! And secondly, and more importantly, we have been recognized by international evaluators to have achieved the top level of care in all of Tanzania.



I have stepped down as the Executive Director of ALMC effective January 1, 2019. Dr. Paul Kisanga, Surgeon and Director of Clinical Services succeeds me. He is an incredible leader and I fully expect that he will surpass what we have done so far.

Our Diocese in Arusha and the ELCA Global Mission department, have jointly requested that Linda I continue to serve in a support capacity. We anticipate being available to provide connections and networking, to lend historical perspective, and to undertake some of the long term planning for the next phases of the hospital. Both churches would like us to continue to be a liaison with our many friends and supporting organizations. And so we intend to spend about half our time still living in Tanzania and the rest in Minnesota.

The ELCA wants us to remain in partnership with you and so we feel honored and blessed. With more time in the US, it will be more convenient to connect with you and visit you with some regularity. Linda and I do look forward to visiting and sharing with you dear and faithful friends who have been our partners for years and years!

My hope and my prayer is that you will remain in relationship with us at ALMC and the ELCA - both as partners and supporters. Let us keep this dream alive together.

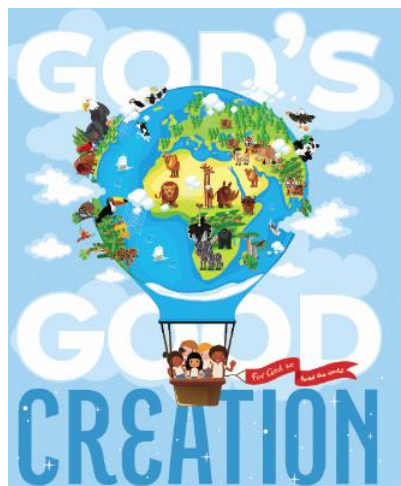
